Water steam distillation of the buds of *Eugenia caryophyllus* ((L.) Merr. & L.M.Perry) and subsequent separation of the water from the essential oil. The subsequent separation is a spontaneous physical process, which normally takes place in a separator (Florentine flask) enabling an easy isolation of the separated oil.

## 4. First aid measures

### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

**IN THE EVENT OF EXCESSIVE INHALATION:** remove the individual to fresh air and keep at rest. Obtain medical advice immediately.

### **7.1 Precautions for safe handling**
